


## making a difference in the lives of children

Our **Youth Prevention** staff teach weekly evidence-based curriculum that empower students to make healthy choices. This year, we taught important Life Skills to children ages 8-13 years old in over 45 schools in the San Antonio Area. Topics included:

- Self-esteem
- Problem Solving
- Healthy Friendships
- Goal Setting
- Coping with Stress

Our Prevention Specialists provided education to more than 4,300 children and young adults.

HYPE is a group of 11-18 year olds who go into the community and spread the message of being drug- and alcohol-free through dance, skits, and peer-to-peer presentations.




## champions of the community

SACADA's Little Warriors Project started in 2013 and is partly funded by the Boeing Employees community Fund. The camp is aimed at children whose parents or guardians are military veterans, retired, or active military.



Little Warriors camp has served over 190 kids within 140 hours of prevention education where campers learn about self-esteem, assertiveness, and making healthy choices.



## making a difference in the lives of adults

### Education Programs

SACADA offers monthly workshops for professionals seeking continuing education hours on topics related to substance abuse. Our offender education programs are state-certified.

### Adult Recovery Services

SACADA provides recovery coaching and support services for those with or at-risk of alcohol and drug problems by providing clients with online and face-to-face options to connect with a peer recovery coach.
